## 4. HIGHLIGHTS

- **Terry Kinyua, ARISE Co-Chair, extended a special welcome to the newly appointed SRSG, Kamal Kishore and heartfelt appreciation to the network leaders** for their tireless efforts in strengthening membership. She also thanked everyone for their diligence in completing the annual activity report exercise and highlighted that annual reporting is a vital tool for showcasing collective progress.
- **Inspiring Actions on the Ground [Americas & Caribbean]**
  - **Mentorship program and Social Equity Fundamentals for DRR** presented by Joyce Coffee, Climate Resilience Consulting, ARISE US
    - The presentation focused on the importance of equity in building resilience. She highlighted how finance guidelines can exacerbate inequities by directing resources away from high-risk areas. Joyce advocated for a broader focus on equity, beyond gender, to include racial and ethnic minorities who face significant threats globally. She suggested UNDRR and the ARISE Board to develop a global equity statement and integrate equity into KPIs, focusing on racial and ethnic minorities.
  - **Private sector and Resilient Infrastructure** presented by Eduardo Kurokawa, Nippon Koei LAC do Brasil, ARISE Individual Member

- Discussed their approach of integrating green infrastructure with existing gray infrastructure to enhance resilience at lower costs. An example highlighted was a drainage system in Minas Gerais, Brazil, showcasing how green infrastructure improvements and specific pipe rehabilitations can mitigate flood impacts and reduce recovery times.
  - **Early Warning Systems and DRR** presented by Carlos Doncel, Space Sur, ARISE Argentina
    - The initiative involves partnering with the Argentine government to equip cities with tools for developing comprehensive risk maps. These maps include vulnerability and threat assessments, which are seamlessly integrated into a user-friendly web application. Carlos emphasized the project's goal of creating a national risk map by consolidating data from various local risk maps.
- **Inspiring Actions on the Ground [Asia-Pacific, Arab States and Africa]**
  - **ARISE Japan Symposium 2024** jointly presented by Masato Takamatsu, ARISE Japan Network Lead and Yoshiko Abe, ARISE Japan Secretariat
    - They highlighted the Noto Peninsula earthquake's impact on the rural region, which revealed significant gaps in Japan's DRR processes. The symposium, held three months after the earthquake, provided a platform for reporting and discussions on successful strategies such as retrofitting old wooden buildings using seismic dampers.
  - **Real Estate Resilience Tool** presented by Mahmoud Al-Burai, ARISE Vice- Chair and Chairman, ARISE UAE
    - The presentation provided insights into how this comprehensive tool provides information and a strategic-level evaluation to help real estate business leaders in any setting to determine how to allocate time and resources to strengthen asset and operational resilience. He mentioned ongoing implementation plans with two pilot projects. The ARISE Climate and Disaster Resilience through Resilient Infrastructure Symposium scheduled for November 25th in Dubai was also announced, which will share ARISE UAE, UAE and others' efforts and successes in resilience-building through infrastructure and investment.
  - **Building SME Resilience vs. Flooding in D.R. Congo** presented by Michel Kahasha, CEO, Dellions, ARISE Central Africa
    - The presentation highlighted the devastating impact of recurring flooding in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). Michel underscored the challenges faced by regions like Kinshasa, Kalemie, and Uvira, where landslides and floods disrupted daily life. SMEs lacked resources and faced severe disruptions. Michel advocated for ARISE's role in enhancing SME risk awareness.
- **ARISE Vice-Chair Mahmoud Al-Burai presented the ARISE Board Workplan 2023-2026** (detailed plans available in workplan, link below)
  - All 6 streams need to work in a coherent manner.

- **Roundtable Discussions [Americas & Caribbean]**
  - Room 1: **Sustainability and Resilience**
    - Participants addressed the misconception that sustainability initiatives are costly, arguing instead that they represent a long-term investment with strategic and human benefits. Resilience and sustainability need to be together, and this should be reflected in all plans and capacity development for business. They stressed the importance of considering local risk (e.g. territorial hazard maps) and contexts within countries when developing global sustainability and resilience plans.
  - Room 2: **Resilience and the business strategy**
    - Participants focused on strategies to incorporate DRR, ESG, and others into business planning and development of BCPs. They highlighted challenges in persuading organizational leaders to prioritize these issues strategically, stressing the need for advocacy within executive boards. Data and knowledge products such as the GAR help, but clarifying financial incentives was noted as crucial to encourage businesses to invest in DRR and view it as strategic investment that can provide competitive advantage.
  - Room 3: **Enhancing Mentorship within networks**
    - The group highlighted the importance of identifying and cataloging expertise across networks to facilitate matching for mentoring purposes. Then, the group focused on two approaches to mentoring. One approach involved transferring existing mentoring practices from the US network to other networks. The second approach emphasized intra-network mentoring, where members within each network would mentor each other based on their specific expertise and needs.
- **Roundtable Discussions [Asia-Pacific, Arab States & Africa]**
  - Room 1: **Diversity of Sectors**
    - The discussion focused on the importance of including a wide array of sectors in ARISE's membership to enrich discussions and foster productive collaborations. Defining key topics, particularly those pertinent to local communities such as SMEs, serves as a foundational step to attract diverse sectors. Moreover, they stressed the strategic alignment of ARISE with large firms and government initiatives as pivotal for making diverse sectors interested in joining a network.
  - Room 2: **Network Workplan Elaboration**
    - The group emphasized the importance of expanding membership to include mid-size and large companies. They proposed integrating

members into the board where feasible and ensuring active engagement from board representatives in their respective regions. Regional workplans were also advocated for. Finally, alignment with local priorities and monitoring systems were noted as crucial. These elements are important for facilitating the elaboration of impactful workplans, which can also help as triggers/examples to establish ARISE networks in more countries.


○ Room 3: **Sustainability and Resilience**

- The group emphasized the importance of practical tools, knowledge sharing, and raising awareness as crucial elements for effective implementation. The group noted the evolution of DRR from a specialized area to a mainstream strategic consideration across various sectors. They also discussed collaborative efforts between large companies and smaller enterprises within supply chains, underscoring the importance of these partnerships in DRR.

- Overall participant representation was 44% male, 56% female.
